The **Get Youth Working!** Program, offers eligible employers in specified regions a \$2,800 hiring incentive to hire eligible youth age 15 to 29.

The Hiring Incentive application is easy!

Conduct your own recruiting and at any time during your recruiting process, or when you are ready to hire, complete and submit an online application. The approval process is quick and easy and if you and your proposed new hire meet the program criteria, you are eligible for the funding.

No complicated paperwork!

Once approved, the \$2,800 hiring incentive is disbursed to you in three equal payments over the first three months of employment.

EMPLOYER CRITERIA

- Youth must be a new hire
- In operation for at least one year
- In good standing with WorkSafeBC
- Must employ youth for a minimum of 3 months
- Must employ youth for a minimum of 30 hours per week
- Eligible regions: Cariboo, Kootenay, Mainland / Southwest*, North Coast and Nechako, Northeast, Thompson-Okanagan, and Vancouver Island / Coast
- Employers will NOT qualify if employee is hired prior to signing Get Youth Working Funding Agreement

*Mainland / Southwest eligible sectors: Agriculture, Hospitality, and Retail

YOUTH CRITERIA

- Unemployed, 15 to 29 years of age
- Not a full-time student or returning to school
- Resident of BC and legally entitled to work in Canada
- Not currently receiving or eligible for EI
- Has not received EI in the past 36 months or 60 months for a parental claim
- Not a participant in another Canada-BC Job Fund program
